INTERVIEW

DIRECTOR DANA NECHUSHTAN

Friendship or unconditional love is a common thread in the versatile oeuvre of director Dana Nechushtan. This was one of the reasons why the creator of hits like DUNYA & DESIE and HOLLANDS HOOP was immediately drawn to the story of PIECE OF MY HEART.

How did this project come your way?

"There was a synopsis about which producer Frans van Gestel of Topkapi Films approached me. Sometimes you immediately have the feeling that something is your story, that you have to sink your teeth into something. For me, PIECE OF MY HEART is the ultimate film about friendship: how far are you willing to go for someone you love? How far will you go for a loved one? Can you set yourself aside to give someone else the opportunity to develop and show his or her talent? And: are you willing to really take someone as she or he is? I thought that was a very beautiful theme. The love between Olga and Irma is not sexual, it is that of a soul mate. That can be much deeper and go much further."

Initially, the plan was to make a biography film about the famous Dutch dancer Olga de Haas. When did you let go of that idea?

"Olga's true story turned out to be getting in our way the more we developed the film. We wanted to go beyond reality and wanted to create a universal narrative about friendship and genius.

Because stories about people who burst on the scene, give their everything and then burn out or disappear can be found all over the world, in all art disciplines. And then reality turns out to be a limitation. We have only kept the name Olga. As a tribute to one of the greatest dancers The Netherlands has ever known. By telling the film from Irma's perspective, we were able to make Olga's talent tangible and to give face to the friendship of these women. A friendship that may not always feel equal, but a friendship that has been chosen from the bottom of the heart."

How did you go about shaping this Olga's world?

"I wanted to create a world that was above reality. All kinds of elements from the seventies can be recognized, but the world in which film takes place stands completely on its own. There is a disco scene in a location that looks like the famous nightclub Paradiso in Amsterdam, but it isn't – we filmed that scene in the Metaalkathedraal in Utrecht, which is a lot more spectacular. There are two scenes that take place on the roof of the Amsterdam City Theatre, with a beautiful view over the Leidseplein – while in real life you can't get to that roof that easily or actually not at all. Also, the theater in the film is made up of six different locations: we shot the theatre hall itself in Leiden, the cellar and the attic are in Wassenaar, and we used the Amsterdam Tropenmuseum for the foyer. I took all the bits of reality and made it my own cinematic reality."





The two protagonists are originally dancers, not actresses. Why did you choose that approach?

"Of course we first checked whether there are actresses in the Netherlands with a dance background. But a dance background wasn't good enough for this film, because I didn't necessarily want to work with body doubles, which would limit me in making a mise-en-scene. The body of a classical ballet dancer is actually impossible to imitate.

They train their whole lives for this, year after year, with blood, sweat and tears. That is impossible to match in a limited time.

Classical ballet dancers such as Irma and Olga have their bodies completely under control and are therefore very recognizable. The position of their feet, the way they walk, stand, bend, etc. You can tell from everything that someone is a classical ballet dancer. This film is rooted in classical ballet and I want to make that tangible in every detail."

With casting dancers you do take the risk that these dancers cannot act well.

"In my previous projects such as DUNYA and DESIE, ZUSJES and ANNIE M.G. I had also worked with inexperienced actors. Elaine Meijerink and Roos Englebert do a fantastic job as Irma and Olga. I never feared they wouldn't be able to handle it. As soon as we had cast them, they started taking drama lessons with Dutch actress Saskia Temmink – for five months, three days a week. They threw themselves wholeheartedly into this project. I also realized that it would be a challenge for them. Ballet is about perfection on the outside, what does something look like? Acting comes from within and shows vulnerability, something unimaginable as a corps de ballet, where every step has to be exactly equal and synchronous. There is little room for your own interpretations. In that respect, classical ballet is really a different discipline than acting."

How did you find Elaine and Roos?

"I actually thought we wouldn't be able to make it work. We had put out the casting call in both the Netherlands and Belgium. And it was at the height of the COVID period, so we had to work a lot with self-tapes that potential lead actresses had sent as an audition. Elaine and Roos were among the first fifteen we looked at, we were all blown away. "That can't be true, two such good candidates, already?" They just were, both: those eyes, that presence. You could look behind their eyes, into their soul. That was the vulnerability we were looking for. We immediately saw that quality on the audition tapes. We watched dozens of tapes after that. But they remained the best, even when we put them together in real life."

Famous Dutch prima ballerina Igone de Jongh has made the choreographies for the film. How did you get in touch with her?

"I previously worked with her on the video clip for the song BIRDS that I directed for Dutch singer Anouk. I had approached Igone because I wanted someone on the set who knew everything about dancing and ballet and who could point out to me if things were not right. Not that I wanted to make a perfectly realistic film, but I do want to know those kinds of things so that I can include those arguments in a consideration and a decision that I then make as a director. Igone said yes almost immediately when I asked. Only later did the idea grow that she would also do the choreographies."

As a director, do you recognize that unbearable pressure that you have to perform and deliver time and again like the dancers in the film?

"As a filmmaker, you create a new world every time. And the next world must always be even more beautiful and even better than the next. This is of course difficult and creates an enormous pressure. But at the same time, the urge to tell stories is bigger for me than the fear of the pressure, luckily."

INTERVIEW

SCREENWRITER ROOS OUWEHAND

At first, screenwriter Roos Ouwehand thought of a biography film about dancer Olga de Haas. The idea gradually changed and became a poetic drama about the friendship between two talented girls that come under pressure.

Where did the idea to write PIECE OF MY HEART come from?

"The first plan was to make a film about the life of Olga de Haas, a famous Dutch ballerina who was very successful in the 1970s. I saw a picture of her hanging on in a theater, in the wings, and was immediately fascinated by her. She was a great talent but died at a young age: she succumbed to anorexia, alcohol and drugs. I was touched by her story: how talent can sometimes hold you in a stranglehold and how success is not always fantastic."

Ultimately, it did not become a biography film.

"No. Many screenplays have a long history and many different stages. That also applied to this project. A second character quickly popped into my head: a friend, someone who loves Olga and has to watch helplessly as she ruins her life. The friendship between the two women was even more interesting to me. That's why I let go of the idea that I wanted to reconstruct the life of Olga de Haas."

I can imagine that writing a biopic has advantages - after all, you know where the story is going - but also some disadvantages.

"Yes that's right. When you make a film about people who really existed, it is very difficult to deviate from their lives. That gives you relatively little freedom as a writer. By letting go of that idea, I was able to make up my own story around an Olga de Haas-esque figure. And her best friend, who witnesses the way Olga destroys herself. And of course does everything he can to help her."

The stress and pressure of fame is a very hot topic. Like Amy Winehouse, or DJ Avicii.

"I think it is of all times. As an outsider, you often have the perception: you have great talent, and you'll be fine with that. Find the right people around you and you will find the right path to deal with all the fame. But that's not how it works."

You have been an actor yourself for many years. Have you been able to draw inspiration from your own experiences?

"Yes, although of course I have never experienced pressure in the way that Amy Winehouse or Avicii or Olga de Haas did. But I do know that feeling that every performance should matter and of course I have also seen with my fellow actors how they sometimes suffered from this. Every evening there are people in the room that you want to show the very best of yourself. That pressure never diminishes, you can never give less of yourself at a show: every time you have to conquer the audience again. And it actually only gets worse after a successful premiere. A

five-star review puts even more pressure on you, because then you have to live up to those expectations every night. The audience then sits in the room with the idea: we are now going to see something that we have never seen before, bring it on."

Why did you choose the ballet world for the story, while you yourself have experience with theater?

"Because ballet dancing is physically even harder than acting. You have to throw yourself one hundred percent physically into a role every night to make all the jumps. That element plays less of a role in drama. I've always found it fascinating that ballet is so exhausting and demanding for the dancers. Sitting in the theatre, as an audience, you often only see the lightness and apparent ease."

You have chosen to set the story in the 1970s, the time of Olga de Haas. Why did you choose that time period?

"I thought it was a beautiful arena for this story because of the contrast between the world of classical ballet - with its strict hierarchy, laws and rituals - and the struggle for more freedom that was going on in the streets at the time: the seventies, full of booze, drugs and flower power. Moreover, at that time, hardly anything was known about anorexia, which main character Olga also struggles with."

Igone de Jongh choreographed the ballet dance routines in the film. Have you spoken to her about that particular stress of the ballet world for your research?

"Yes. Though I think Igone is a different kind of ballerina than Olga. Igone is much more like her best friend Irma, who functions very much on strict discipline. Practice makes perfect. Olga is a dancer who mainly dances on her emotion. There are many different ways in which you can develop your own talent."

Did you often think about the movie BLACK SWAN while writing? That film deals with the same theme: a dancer who succumbs to the pressure.

"Occasionally yes. But at the same time, I wanted to stay far away from BLACK SWAN, because I'm not into horror at all. I couldn't really do anything with that element of that film. My stories focus much more on relationships between people: how do people interact with each other, and what consequences does that have? That was also the starting point for PIECE OF MY HEART much more than Olga's internal demons. For me, the powerlessness with which Irma has to see that her friend slowly but surely falls is also a kind of horror. But then a horror that I can connect with."

INTERVIEW

COPRODUCERS BRACHA VAN DOESBURG EN DAAN SCHUURMANS (TRIANGLE FILM)

Spouses Bracha van Doesburgh and Daan Schuurmans have acted together before - they even got to know each other on stage. However, the film PIECE OF MY HEART marks their first collaboration as producers.

There are at least six other projects on the shelf of their new-fledged company Triangle Film.

Why are you taking this new step in your career?

BRACHA: "As an actor, you are usually only involved in a project at a fairly late stage in the process: there is already a producer, a script, a director. Sometimes that is regrettable and you would like to think along from the very beginning about what a film or series should look like."

Producing a movie has quite some challenges. What were the biggest hurdles you encountered?

DAAN: "Our most sensible decision was to approach producer Frans van Gestel of Topkapi Films. We have both known him for a long time and from him we have learned a lot over the years about the profession of producer and what it involves." **BRACHA**: "We mainly focused on the substantive side of the project. Making films and series is a matter of patience – the first plan of PIECE OF MY HEART came about nine years ago."

The film started out as a tribute to famous Dutch dancer Olga de Haas. What is your link to her life?

BRACHA: "I knew her story. There have been plans before to make a film about her life. The idea never really let go of me. I once saw her portrait hanging in the Stadsschouwburg in Amsterdam when I was performing there – besides all the paintings of actors there, she is the only ballerina with her own painting."

DAAN: "Olga's story is very moving. In fact, in addition to being a dancer, she was also a talented actress, she could empathize very well with the story she told with her body. Perhaps that is why she was immortalized in that theatre."

The story is now about the deep friendship between young dancers Olga and Irma. How did you guys make that twist in the plot, when did you let go of the biopic?

BRACHA: "Making a biopic is quite complicated. You have a lot of facts to take into account if you want to do justice to the person in question. And so the story pretty quickly becomes very linear: and then this happened, and then that.

Screenwriter Roos Ouwehand suggested that we would shift the focus to the friendship between the two girls. For example, we tell the story through Irma, Olga's best friend."

DAAN: "There are similarities with the way in which Mozart's life story is told in AMADEUS, you follow everything through the eyes of Salieri in the film and play of the same name. There, too, a construction has been found to tell Mozart's story through another person. At its core, PIECE OF MY HEART still contains the story of Olga de Haas. But it gave a lot of freedom to turn those elements into a fictional new story."

What exactly is the input of a creative producer?

BRACHA: "It starts with a good idea and you then look for the right people. We talked to Roos Ouwehand about whether she wanted to develop the screenplay. We approached Frans van Gestel and he was immediately enthusiastic about the idea. He suggested Dana Nechushtan as the director, she was also enthusiastic and knew exactly what she wanted to do with the story. After that, we were very closely involved in developing the script."

DAAN: "During shooting, you receive the scenes that have been shot every day. That was very exciting when we opened the emails with the files. I also find the editing a very inspiring phase, that's when the film really takes shape. And now that the film is ready, we will help shaping the plans of how the end result will be sold to the world. Which target groups can the film appeal to, how would we want to reach them? It's really nice to actively think about those things surrounding one of our projects for once."

Especially in Hollywood, actors who produce a film often play along themselves. Have you considered that too?

BRACHA: "With this film we kept it at co-producing. Something we are doing for the first time and where we still have a lot to learn. But we will certainly also will be playing in the projects that are in the pipeline."

ELAINE MEIJERINK Irma Roeters

Elaine Meijerink is a dancer and actress. In 2022 she obtained her Bachelor's degree at the Royal Conservatory in The Hague and she is currently working on her second Bachelor's degree at Codarts Hogeschool for the Arts in Rotterdam,

The Netherlands. In the fall of 2022 she will start an acting workshop at De Toneelmeester in Amsterdam. Elaine makes her acting debut with her leading role as Irma in PIECE OF MY HEART.

Although she has been involved in dance from an early age, she also gets a lot of energy and pleasure from acting and she hopes to develop further through both dance and acting in film and theater.



ROOS ENGLEBERT Olga van Heemst

Roos Englebert is an actress, dancer and model and started ballet lessons at the age of three.

She started at primary school at the conservatory and then attended the Royal Conservatory in her birthplace The Hague.

From this education she

did an internship at Introdans. In 2021 she was approached via social media to audition for PIECE OF MY HEART, in which she plays the lead role of Olga van Heemst.



PETER PAUL MULLER Jacob van Heemst

Jacob van Heemst Peter Paul Muller graduated in 1991 from the Maastricht Theater Academy. He broke through to the general public with his role of Mark in the film and later television series ALL STARS (1997).

After (leading) roles in the films ALL IS LOVE, DE PASSIEVRUCHT and DE DOMINEE, Peter Paul was

featured in the comic drama series GOOISCHE VROUWEN from 2005, which also featured two cinema films. Under the name of his character Martin Morero, he scored a modest hit with the single ECHTE LIEFDE/REAL LOVE. For his supporting role in the first GOOISCHE VROUWEN movie, Peter Paul was awarded a Golden Calf award for Best Supporting Actor. In 2017, he was again awarded a Golden Calf for Best Actor for his title role of the South African lawyer in the film BRAM FISCHER.

Since then, Peter Paul has appeared in the Dutch TV series HOLLANDS HOOP, MAUD & BABS, ALL STARS & ZONEN and the films ALL YOU NEED IS LOVE, DE OOST and ALLES OP TAFEL.



GIJS SCHOLTEN VAN ASCHAT Walter van Sweelinck

Gijs Scholten van Aschat is one of the most renowned actors in the Netherlands. He is granted with all important Dutch theatre and film awards. He is famous for his Shakespeare interpretations. In 2010 Gijs took residency

at Toneelgroep Amsterdam. This prominent theatre company is led by director Ivo van Hove. Gijs is known to a bigger audience with his roles in the play PLEIDOOI en OUD GELD. He is awarded with a Gouden Kalf award in 1998 for his role in OUD GELD. And in 2013 again for his role in the film CLOACA and the film TIRZA based on the book by Arnon Grunberg. TIRZA was selected as the Dutch entry for the Best Foreign Language Film at the 83rd Academy Awards. In 2012 Gijs makes his debut as a literary author with his novella BERETTA BOBCAT. The personally narrated audio book, was a gift during the Week of the Audio Book 2012. In 2015 Gijs is one of the lead characters in the film PUBLIEKE WERKEN. In 2016 Gijs was seen in the film DE HELLEVEEG based on a novel by A.F.T.H van der Heijden and he played one of the lead characters in the drama series ALS DE DIJKEN BREKEN. In 2016, in addition to the premieres of DE DINGEN DIE

VOORBIJGAAN and OBSESSION, he can also be seen in the revivals of DE STILLE KRACHT, HUSBAND AND WIVES, ROMAN TRAGEDIES and HET JAAR VAN DE KREEFT (nomination Louis d'Or) of TONEELGROEP AMSTERDAM.

In 2019 / 2020 he can be seen in the television series HOOGVLIEGERS, DE VLOER OP and in the movie NOCTURE.



JAN KOOIJMAN Toby

Jan Kooijman is a multitalented Dutch actor, TVhost, dancer and singer. He started his career as a professional dancer at the Scapino Ballet in Rotterdam. In 2010 he received the prestigious Dutch Television Star for

'Best Upcoming Talent', and in 2011 he received a Kids Choice Award for 'Best Dutch and Belgium TV-star'. In 2012 he played his first lead role in the feature film IN LOVE AT IBIZA (2013) by Johan Nijenhuis. After that, he played

several lead roles in box office successes and has been a household name in Holland and Belgium since. He is also a jury member on shows like Dancing with the Stars and So You Think You Can Dance in The Netherlands and Belgium. In addition, he is developing series and he is also writing songs. Next up Jan can be seen in the feature PIECE OF MY HEART directed by Dana Nechustan and in the lead of the film SUMMER IN FRANCE.



YANNICK JOZEFZOON Clemens Barendregt

Yannick started acting with theatre group DNA and appeared in several film- and television productions at a young age. In 2011 he got accepted at the Academy of Dramatic Arts in Maastricht were he

graduated as an actor in 2015. He acted in films like BOIY 7, DE HELD and AS IF I'M CRAZY and television series including MEIDEN VAN DE HERENGRACHT and SMERIS. In the theater he played in productions at the companies of Het Nationale Theater and Likeminds. He starred in three solo performances, including VOOR MIJN KINDEREN with Likeminds. DANIEL BOISSEVAIN Kees Roeters

Daniel Boissevain is one of the most established actors with a long-running career in film, television and theatre. He is known for his roles in the feature film A PIECE OF MY HEART (2022), THE HOST (2020),

ALBERTA (2016) and the blockbuster GOOISCHE VROUWEN (2011). He starred in several TV series including OOGAPPELS (2019 - 2021, NPO), the long-running series ALL STARS (1999-2020, NPO), BRUSSEL (2017, KPN) and the popular series GOOISCHE VROUWEN (2006 - 2009, RTL). On stage, he starred in several productions including THE BROKEN CIRCLE BREAKDOWN (2014) and THE GUILTY (2022) which he also co-produced.

Flemish actress Katelijne Damen is known for her theater work at, among others, the Toneelhuis, Ro Theater, Het Zuidelijk Toneel and Blauwe Monday Cie. She has appeared in television series such as TERUG

In 1990 she was awarded the Dutch theater prize the Theo d'Or for her role in STRANGE INTERLUDE. She was also awarded the Flemish Oscar De Gruyter audience prize for this role. She won this prize for her skirt in LOSING TIME. In 1996 Katelijne was awarded the Dutch Mary Dresselhuys Prize for her "versatile creativity, for her total commitment to theater and for her oeuvre". She was nominated in 2006 for the Dutch Columbina Prize for her role in HERSENSCCHIMMEN. She has also appeared in the films DE PATRICK, ROSIE & MOUSSA, DE PREMIER and GIRL.

Director

Dana Nechushtan graduated in 1994 from the Netherlands Film and Television Academy in Amsterdam.

With her graduation film DJINN she won several awards and is also nominated for the Oscar for Best Student Film. With Joop van den Ende she immediately can start working on a new youth television series: 20PLUS. Due to the striking approach of this series, Dana was noticed by the Dutch broadcasters VPRO, VARA and NPS and asked to co-direct the tv series LABYRINT, directly followed by the projects IVOREN WACHTERS and NOVELLEN: DE DAG, DE NACHT and HET DUISTER.

In 2000 Dana directed her first feature film TOTAL LOSS, followed by several television films that have won awards in The Netherlands and abroad such as DE BELAGER, NECROCAM and the TV series DUNYA and DESIE. DUNYA AND DESIE was nominated twice for an International Emmy Award.

For the political film OFFERS, lead actress Maryam Hassouni was rewarded with an International Emmy Award for Best Actress the following year.

In 2006 and 2007 Dana made two feature films back to back. NACHTRIT and DUNYA & DESIE – THE FILM, have both been awarded several times and are shown all over the world.

In 2008 she directed the big seven-part television series ANNIE MG, full of song and dance. This series has also won several prizes and was welcomed at many festivals. In 2012, Dana directs her first theatre play, DON JUAN, which is very well reviewed and even invited to the Dutch Theatre Festival.

In 2013, the 8-part television series HOLLANDS HOOP follows, a crime comedy set in the Dutch countryside. HOLLANDS HOOP has won several awards and is sold all over the world. This results in Dana making 24 episodes of this hit series in eight years.

In 2022 the feature film PIECE OF MY HEART will be released, Dana's biggest challenge to date: a gripping, visual film about a blossoming friendship between two talented ballet dancers, set against the background of the colorful but also relentless 1970s.

ROOS OUWEHAND

Screenplay

Roos Ouwehand (1968) writes for film, television, theater and magazines and is also an actress. After graduating from drama school, she joined the acting ensemble of Toneelgroep Amsterdam. For her role of Marie in EEN SOORT HADES, directed by Gerardjan Rijnders, she was awarded the 1997 Colombina Theater Prize for Best Supporting Actress. From 2002 she appeared in series and films such as VLUCHT HS13, BLOEDVERWANTEN, KEYZER and DE BOER ADVOCATEN, TBS and LEEF!. She also played for various theater companies such as Suburbia and De Utrechtse Spelen. In addition to acting, she also started writing around 2005, including columns for Dutch newspaper NRC Handelsblad and a number of magazines. In addition, she wrote the book EIGENLIJK BEN IK SPAANS about the life and work of actor Joop Admiraal, which was published by Nijgh and Van Ditmar. In 2012, Ouwehand made her debut as a screenwriter with the Talpa television series DORIS starring Tjitske Reidinga. The film DORIS, the successful cinema sequel to the series, was released in 2018, directed by Albert Jan van Rees. She herself also appeared as an actress in both the series and the film. In 2019, MI VIDA (Phanta Film, directed by Norbert ter Hall) a cinema film about a 63-year-old hairdresser from Schiedam who leaves for Spain to pursue her dreams, premiered. Ouwehand received a Golden Calf award nomination for her screenplay.

In 2015, her first play SOPHIE premiered at the DeLaMar Theatre, with Tjitske Reidinga in the lead role, directed by Antoine Uitdehaag. In March 2019, the German premiere of SOPHIE took place at the Ernst Deutsch Theater in Hamburg, where it was very well received. In 2019 and 2020 and 2021, the first three seasons of the BNNVARA series OOGAPPELS directed by Wil Koopman, on which Ouwehand co-wrote, was broadcasted. Season four has now been filmed and Ouwehand is currently working on the screenplays for the fifth season.

Ballet choreographies

Prima ballerina Igone de Jongh ended her 24-year career with The Dutch National Ballet in October 2019 to make a new start as an independent dancer. She was educated at the National Ballet Academy in The Netherlands and The Royal Ballet School in London and then went through all ranks at Dutch National Ballet in seven years; at the age of 24 she was promoted to first soloist.

Igone is known for her special performances of the classical ballet repertoire and as the muse of Dutch choreographer Hans van Manen. She is the Netherlands' most famous ballerina of her generation. Since 2015, TV viewers have also known her as a jury member on the SBS6 tv show DANCE DANCE DANCE. Igone danced many leading roles with the Dutch National Ballet, including Julia (Romeo and Juliet), Odette/Odile (Swan Lake), Giselle (Giselle) and Aurora (Sleeping Beauty). Her farewell at the Dutch National Ballet was with with her favorite role, that of Julia.
